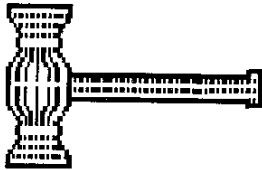

A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Water, Water everywhere, and not a drop to drink. Garbage, Garbage everywhere, boy it sure does stink. When investigating the garbage fee situation, we sure turned up a lot of stink. This is a classic example of what a monopoly can produce. This issue alone produced more phone calls to me than any other. \$18 per month does not sound too bad to those of you who had been paying \$16.50 per month. But to those of us who had been paying \$11 to \$13 per month, this was a massive increase. After hearing Waste Management's side of the story, I could understand that they are operating within the guidelines of sound business practices. As Mr. Tom Phares challenged, if we can find another company to pick up our garbage for less, have at it. Well, Mr. Phares has issued a challenge that I will not forget.

Mr. Dooley, our vice-president has arranged for a reduction in fees to \$16.00 per month. I will not steal his thunder. His article will follow with the details.

I feel that we should investigate alternative garbage collection companies before making any final decisions. Therefore, I recommend that you pay only this monthly charges of \$16 with your water bill until all alternatives have been investigated. Paying an annual fee at this time will not be refundable if the decision is made to change companies.

For those of you that have noticed, the Neutral Ground on Eden Isles Drive was edged and cleaned through the efforts of the GREEN--FORCE committee. Pam White's article with an up-to-date report on their activities will follow.

Our next meeting will be next Tuesday, Jan. 28th, at the Tammany Yacht Club at 7:30 pm. Let's overwhelm the Yacht Club Personnel with a standing room only crowd. In fact I will be the first to give up my seat to someone standing. I look forward to seeing all of you then.

**E.I.H.O.A. NEGOTIATES
PROPOSAL FOR GARBAGE COLLECTION SERVICES**

During 1991, the residents of Eden Isles paid various rates for their garbage pick-up, and they had the option to utilize one of two companies. The two companies were Waste Management and All That Garbage. Just prior to 1991, there was a third company, Coastal Disposal, however, they sold their company to Waste Management. Needless to say, there was a variety of billing arrangements in effect. At the end of 1991, there was only one company collection garbage in Eden Isles, but the residents were still being billed at various rates. Additionally, a landfill disposal increase of \$10 per ton (from \$35 to \$45 per ton) was imposed on all disposal companies at year end. In order to rectify the various billing rates and to overcome the additional disposal charges, Waste Management chose to unilaterally raise all customers in Eden Isles to \$18 per month.

The following is an approximate breakdown of Eden Isles customer billing rates for 1991 followed by the percentage of residents paying at that rate:

- \$11.00 to \$11.50 per month -- 20%
(Annual payers to Coastal and ATG)

- \$13.50 to \$14.50 per month -- 14%
(Monthly payers to ATG and annual payers to Waste Management)

- \$16.50 per month -- 66%
(Monthly payers to Waste Management)

When the Eden Isles Homeowners' Association approached Waste Management about their unilateral rate increase, they seemed to be open for discussion. The explained their rationale for the rate increase was based strictly on the rate hike for the landfill disposal. Their disposal rates were raised 29%, and therefore, they thought they, in turn, raised their rates by 29%. Since their average customer was paying a little over \$14, they raised all rates to \$18. We agreed that the company should be able to recover the cost of the land^{hike}, but the cost of disposal is not the "total" cost of doing business. Their total cost of doing business was probably increased only 14%.

After negotiating with the general manager of Waste Management, the following proposal was offered to the resident of Eden Isles:

• **MONTHLY RATE -- \$16.00** This represents a 3% decrease to 66% of the residents. The garbage bill will continue to be shown on the monthly water bill.

• **ANNUAL RATE -- \$176.00** This equates to \$14.67 per month. This will be a one time payment due in January, payable directly to Waste Management. This represents an average rate increase of 12% to annual payers. Depending on your previous mode of payment, it may be a little more or a little less.

Senior Citizen Discounts will be given to monthly payers who are age 63 and older. With proof of age, the customer will be given the month of December free, if they have paid for the previous eleven months. The Senior Citizen discount does not apply to annual payers.

Waste Management will send out a letter, offering an annual payment to residents of Eden Isles. If you have already paid your January water bill including your garbage collection fee, and you wish to become an annual payer, please contact Waste Management to discuss arrangements to reconcile your bill. Waste Management will notify Coast Water Company that the new monthly garbage collection fee will be \$16 and that some residents will be paying directly to their company on an annual basis.



Compared to the original flat rate of \$18 per month per residence, this proposal saves \$2 per month for 66% of our residents. Using an average of 700 occupied residences in Eden Isles, the Homeowners' Association has negotiated a savings of over \$25,000 for the residents of our subdivision.

When considering whether or not to join the Homeowners' Association at the cost of \$20 per year per family, please remember that the association has already saved each household a minimum of \$24 this year; and it's only January. If we all work together, these benefits will continue to surface throughout the year.
