CLECO'S THREE YEAR PROJECT HAS BEGUN IN EDEN ISLES

Central Louisiana Electric Company has begun replacing underground power cables and conduit which will greatly increase service reliability according to Customer Service Manager, John Braun.

The three year project involves trenching activity within the 10-foot utility easement. It will be CLECO's goal to fill in and re-sod trenching sites at each day's end.

The \$2 million project includes replacement of transformers and installation of cable of improved design. As a result, service reliability in Eden Isles will be greatly enhanced.

CLECO has assigned Mr. Calise Lopez to closely monitor the entire project. He is authorized to take measures to resolve problems or answer questions Eden Isles residents may have in the meantime. He may be contacted at (504) 647-7809 at CLECO's Slidell Operations Center.



EDEN ISLES, OAK HARBOR OR EDEN ISLES OF OAK HARBOR?

The new Landmark Land Co. development of Oak Harbor will actually be divided by into unique areas called "Inlets of Oak Harbor" and "Fairways of Oak Harbor". The waterfront property will be called the "Inlets" and the golf course property will be called "Fairways". The Eden Isles Marina will be called the Oak Harbor Marina and the club house and golf course will be called Oak Harbor Yacht and Country Club. Future distinctions will be made however, all will be included under the "Oak Harbor" name in some way.

Eden Isles residents have an opportunity to decide whether we want to call ourselves Oak Harbor, Eden Isles of Oak Harbor or just remain Eden Isles as we have in the past. The difference in calling ourselves something other than just Eden Isles may or may not have some benefit to us. Landmark Land Co.'s marketing V.P., Joey Scontrino, has indicated that there is no objection to Eden Isles calling itself Oak Harbor or Eden Isles of Oak Harbor. In fact, Mr. Scontrino believes that a name change would overcome objections to the painting the water tower and other facilities permit Eden Isles property owners to benefit from the advertising campaign being developed for the Oak Harbor area. Landmark Land Co. would not begin maintaining our common grounds or pay for our security service if we changed our name. We would still need a plan for providing these and other desired services ourselves. Membership in the Oak Harbor Yacht and Country Club will be welcomed in any case and monthly dues will be the same for both Eden Isles and Oak Harbor residents. The only difference is that Eden Isles residents will have to pay an initiation fee whereas Oak Harbor landowners will not since Landmark Land Co. will be profiting from land sales there and initiation fees will be included in the price of the lots.

LITTER COMMITTEE

Litter in the Eden Isles community is a problem that can be solved. Hooray! Unlike so many of society's other problems, litter can be swept away easily and cheaply. It can be prevented at no cost to the taxpayer, and a litter pick-up campaign can even bring in a profit. Hooray, but how do you say?

The Eden Isles Homeowner's Association would like to form a Litter Committee to tackle this problem in three steps.

#1: The trash that rests on the ground and sides of the canals will be picked up. The committee will encourage regular participation by volunteers, such as a roving foot and boat patrol; and organize specific clean-up days when everyone can join in the fun. The committee will provide a safe, healthy way to clean up the area and will encourage family participation. The Sea Scouts will be involved in this project but all volunteers are welcome and needed.

#2: Most of the items that dot our community are aluminum cans and paper products that can easily be recycled. Even glass, plastic and metals can be recycled; and this means that a community clean-up can generate money as well as community pride. The Litter Committee will encourage residents to separate recyclable items in the home and look into the best way to pool our trash for dollars. Perhaps the committee can find a way to provide neighborhood trash cans and recyclable bins for those of us that just can't wait until we get home to dispose of items.

#3: The Litter Committee will encourage the prevention of further pollution. Although this part of the plan may be the hardest and take the longest -- it can be done. Thank goodness no one is physically addicted to rolling down the car window and tossing something out. Even non-residents are less likely to litter a clean area.

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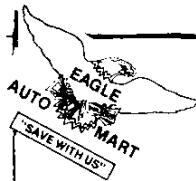

LAWN AND GARDEN TIPS FOR MARCH

March is the ideal time to begin fertilization of lawns, trees, and shrubs. Distribute the fertilizer evenly around the plants and water in. Do not allow raw fertilizer to stick to stems or leaves as burning may result.


For trees, starting 1 or 2 feet from the trunk drill holes about 1 foot apart, fill with 2-3 inches of fertilizer. Do this in concentric rings around the tree to extend just beyond the outermost branches.

Using a "weed and feed" fertilizer is a good idea for lawn maintenance. Be careful to avoid getting the weed and feed too close to trees and shrubs.



is also a good idea in March to cut your lawn very short, just above the grass runners. This helps to remove dead grass and reduces thatching. Be sure to collect all clippings and dispose of them.

The sinking of lawns causing ruts is a natural process where by soil sinks due to oxidation of the organic matter. Vegetation growing on a 60' x 120' lot can transpire (taking up and giving off water) up to 270 gallons of water on a summer day. With this water loss organic matter decomposes in the presence of oxygen by converting from a solid to a gas and sinking can occur. The best way to combat this is in the Spring after fertilization when grass is actively growing. Fill in ruts using sharp sand, one or two inches high leaving the tips of the grass exposed to sunlight. As the grass grows through you may continue to fill.



Continue to treat lawns with Diazinon and mole cricket bait for mole crickets.

SAFETY NOTES

1. Recently, a serious mishap occurred at a construction site on Moonraker Drive. Whether the cause was due to carelessness or a prank gone awry is not known as of this writing.

This is what happened - during the cold snap, some construction workers started a fire in a ditch. A cement truck driver, waiting to off-load, went up to the fire to warm up. An "empty" aerosol paint can in the fire exploded, severely burning the driver's face. Reportedly, he did not lose his eyesight but suffered second degree burns.

Aerosol containers, capped bottles, and other closed items are potentially hazardous and should never be burned.

2. Regarding open fires, especially those set at construction sites, have proved a nuisance here at Eden Isles. The Fire Department has been called to extinguish several to date.

Open burning, like most things in life, should be governed by common sense. Fires should never be left unattended nor set close to structures; they should be kept small and smoke and sparks should not be allowed to impinge onto adjacent properties.
