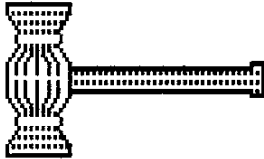

A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

This month we have reached a couple of significant milestones. The first is that we now have over **900** homes occupied or under construction in the subdivision. There remains about 375 vacant lots (not counting the undeveloped land on Moonraker Island), most of which are on Moonraker Drive.

The second and most important to us is that we now have over **300** active members for the 1993 calendar year. What disturbs me, however, is that about 60 members from 1992 have not yet renewed their memberships, some of whom have been very supportive in the past. We will be sending out the last reminders for this year in the next few weeks. If you know that you haven't paid, send your check in now so that we won't have to waste the postage on the reminder. If you are not renewing because something has been done to offend you, please call me and give us a chance to reconcile our differences.

There seems to be a stirring of interest in the fact that Clipper Inc. is applying to develop their property at the end of Moonraker Drive. It is important that

those who have an interest in the results of this development become acquainted with what is happening, and what they must do to voice their opinions (a good starting point would be to call Gary Rinck, our Police Juror). It will be too late to do anything after the permits are issued. To the best of my knowledge, Clipper Inc. is acting within the bounds of the existing zoning for the property.

Our next meeting will be held on **Tuesday, March 30th** at the **Tammany Yacht Club**. **Buddy Stall** will be the guest speaker. If you have never heard one of his talks, be prepared for a real treat. We will begin a brief business meeting promptly at 7:30 PM. Mr. Stall will begin his presentation at 8:30 PM. I hope to see you then.

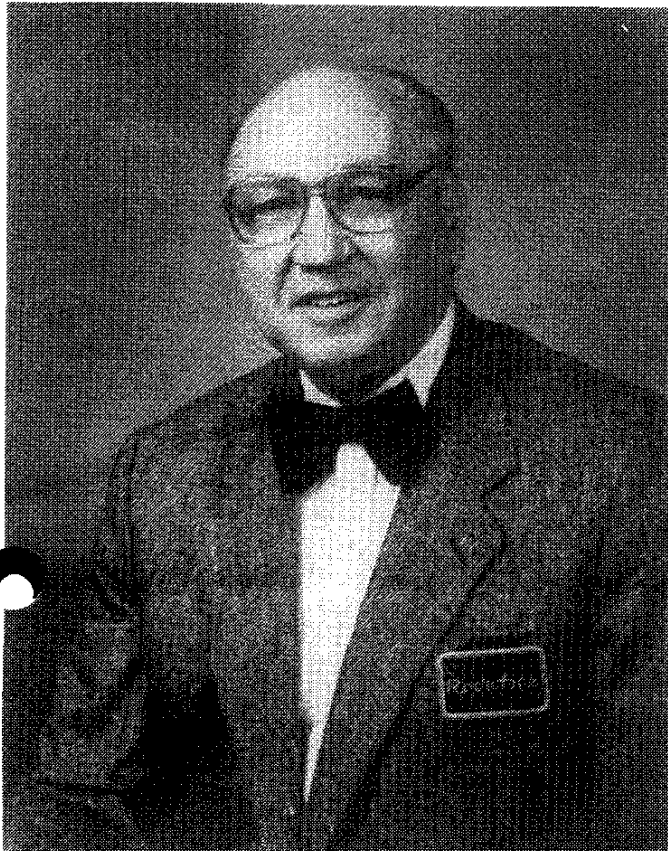

Please cooperate and obey our speed limits.

PET OWNERS BEWARE

The Parish has a leash law that is not being enforced. There are too many dogs and cats which are allowed to roam the neighborhood. If they were to be run over by a speeding car, their owners would be quick to blame the uncaring driver for doing their pet in. Dogs and cats are wandering the neighborhood and doing their business in their neighbor's yard. Personally, I'm annoyed by a neighborhood cat using my garden for a litter box. There is a little dark grey poodle who must never get fed by his owner, because he is always tearing up garbage bags and scattering it all over while looking for something to eat.

If you are tired of annoyances caused by your neighbors animals, make your reports to Deputy Kenny Baham, at 646-4075, ext. 323, Monday through Friday 8 AM to 4:30 PM. He will arrange to pick up the animals.

If you are a pet owner, please keep your animals home, in your own house and yard. Don't violate the law, or let your animal continue to be a nuisance to your neighbors.

Extra guard hours were provided on Saturday, February 13th to help facilitate incoming traffic for the Krewe of the Bilge Boat Parade. In addition, we asked that the Sheriff's department patrol Moonraker Drive during the hours of 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. so as to assist in case of trespassing or criminal damage complaints. We hope these kind of "extras" provide our residents an additional measure of safety and enjoyment of their community.

This year we are trying to divide the administration of the Security Service into two parts: that of "Treasurer" and "Guard Service Liaison." We're happy to report that we've found our Treasurer in **Alice Rhodes** who, with her husband, **Phil**, moved into a new home at 317 Eden Isles Drive last October. Alice and Phil relocated from Baton Rouge, where she was employed for the last 15 years as office manager for an industrial painting contractor. She will be handling all record-keeping, i.e., invoicing, accounts receivable and payable, banking, etc. Alice will also be selling decals and license plates, so if you have a need for these articles or just a question about your account, please call her at **643-0559**. We are confident that her skills and business experience will inure to the benefit of the Security Service as well as the entire community.

Temporarily (because no one has stepped forward), I am still handling Guard Service Liaison; that includes scheduling and overseeing of guards, and working with Inner Parish Security to provide the most effective service possible. Contrary to published reports of my "retirement," it is my intention to continue working with the Security Committee, but at a reduced level of time and involvement.

We need new members on the Security Committee. So, if you are a security supporter and can attend three or four evening meetings per year, please call Alice

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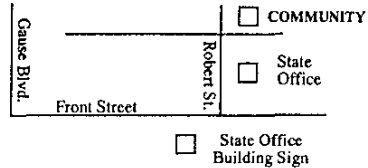
