POLICE JURY DISTRICT 13 REPORT

First I would like to thank all of the residents who supported me during the campaign. Without your support, we would not have been able to put our campaign organization together so quickly and jumped ahead during the early weeks of the campaign.

Since taking office, there are several things that I have been working on and several appointments have been made. Getting the road and drainage projects off the ground have been tops on the list of things to do and several projects, including the District 13 Newsletter have had to take a back seat. It is time that we got the road projects moving.

As for the various projects that affect Eden Isles/Northshore area, there have been three appointments. Robert Lazar has been appointed as a Commissioner on Fire District No. 1 to replace me and John Erickson was appointed to replace me as Commissioner on the Eden Isles Community Services District. Marcelle Stone was re-appointed as a Commissioner on the Northshore Beach Recreation District.

As far as road projects go, Northshore Drive (Rat's Nest Road) and Eden Isles Drive are being completely redone under the capital improvements program (2¢ sales tax issue). Moonraker Drive is to be partially resurfaced in the worst areas, under the same program. Rampage Loop is under engineering now to determine if it can be done under Special Road District #15 money as well as repairing the Moonraker bridge.

The lighting district, under the leadership of A.K. Wilson has just submitted a new round of street lights. Many of the lights will be placed on U.S. 11, Carr Drive and Northshore Drive. These lights should make many of these areas safer at night.

The intersection of Windward Passage and Charles Court has been made a 4-way stop. The signs should be in place before this newsletter is circulated. The utility boxes on that same corner are to be removed, or buried within the next two or three months.

During the past weekend, the Eden Isles Anti Litter Committee and the Quail Ridge Homeowner's Association did quite a bit of clean up work on the major roads outside their subdivisions (U.S. 11 and Military Road). The residents along U.S. 11 and Carr Drive are presently organizing to clean up their areas on canals and it is my hope that by everyone pitching in, we will get the entire district cleaned up. We are going to continue to get the abandoned camps removed to help spruce up the area.

SECURITY

In recent weeks, we have had an unusual number of complaints regarding the performance of the security guards. In order to clarify their duties and endeavor to eliminate these complaints, members of the Eden Isles Security Committee met with Fox Security personnel. Following are the responsibilities of the guards as agreed upon at this meeting:

1. Patrols are made by the guard at the gate on each shift. (Times of these patrols to vary)
2. Drivers of cars without plates or decals are stopped and questioned as to their names and destinations. This information is part of their daily report. The ONLY time this is NOT done is to avoid a backup on Highway 11.
3. License plates on cars that pass the guardhouse without stopping are recorded, if possible, and also becomes a part of the daily report.
4. Upon request, guards will keep an eye on your property while you are out of town. Requests must be made by calling the Fox Security Office at 643-0295. They, in turn, will notify the guards.
5. An additional "roving guard" will patrol four hours on Friday and Saturday nights.

It must be recognized that the guards often have telephone calls to answer, notes and written comments to make regarding reports, etc. However, if you feel the guard is consistently lax in his/her duties, please fill in the form below and mail it to the Eden Isles Security Committee, P.O. Box 3095, Slidell, LA 70458. We will keep a log of these complaints and forward them to Fox Security. Steps will be taken to correct these problems immediately.

LAWN AND GARDEN TIPS FOR MAY

Fig Trees need special attention this month. Water, water, water, during dry weather to prevent fruit drop. Spray trees with Fixed copper to prevent thread-blight and rust fungus from attacking and killing the leaves. Do this spraying by late May and not less than one month before the fruit ripens. July is the usual time for fruit ripening in this area.

Roses - Black spot on rose leaves can be controlled if a rigid spray schedule is followed. Spraying every 7-10 days is necessary for good control. Funginex and Benomyl give good results. Funginex is best for control of powdery mildew. Powdery Mildew shows up as a white powdery substance on leaves and stems. It causes distortion of parts it attacks.

Leaf yellow on gardenia, magnolia, azalea, camelia and Magnolia Fuscata may be occurring now. It is a natural occurrence if not excessive. If the veins are green and yellow is apparent between the veins, it may be iron chlorosis. Spray with liquid iron. For leaf miners on tomato, bell pepper, squash and cucumber, control with Diazinor.

Cucumber wilt is spread by beetles, control them by spraying with Sevin.

Make second application of fertilizer to ornamental plants, trees and lawn. Prune and fertilize azalea spirca flowering quince, camellia, viburnum, gardenia and primrose jasmine after they bloom.

LAWN & GARDEN TIPS (continued)

Aeration or Cultivation of Lawns - Another procedure that helps maintain a quality turf is aeration or cultivation. Aeration is a mechanical method of improving the exchange of water and air between the atmosphere and the soil. It particularly helps to alleviate soil compaction, which is a major problem in our area. Aeration helps to alleviate restricted penetration of fertilizer. Also it encourages a deeper and more extensive root system, while at the same time increases shoot density. This makes the lawn appear more lush and vigorous.

Aeration is best done during active growth such as spring, early summer or early fall. The soil should be moist while the operation is being done.

Aeration may be accomplished through the use of cultivating machines or hand rollers with spikes welded on the roller drum. The spikes may be hollow or solid. Rental companies offer these cultivating machines or aerators for rent.

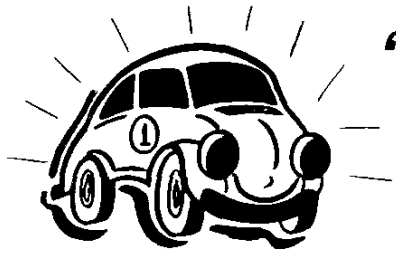

POTHOLES, POTHOLES!

Monday, April 24th, the Parish Public Works crew filled potholes in Eden Isles. They followed the list of potholes that was supplied to them. If your local pothole was not on the list or on the crew's drive-through route, chances are it was not filled.

To make sure your pothole is filled, report it to Safety, 127 Carina Circle. Be certain to give an address to expedite locating the culprit pothole for the next road crew drive-through.

VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY FUND-RAISING

The North Shore Volunteer Fire Department is starting its annual fund raising. A donation of \$20.00 is requested from each homeowner for this vital service. And, the donation is tax deductible.

Remember that the N.S.V.F.D. responded to fires in Eden Isles as well as participates in worthwhile community services such as the Santa for Tots drive-through last Christmas.

Funds are needed to train and equip volunteer personnel and fuel and equip the fire engines. Help those who help us. Soon you will receive a letter asking for your contribution.

DANGER: DRY CELL BATTERIES

Recently a flashlight failed (end cap separated due to stress corrosion). Examination of the damaged flashlight revealed two different type dry cell batteries were installed.

The manufacturer conducted an investigation into the accident, and determined the end cap failed due to stress fracture, coupled with a strong radial outward force exerted by the flashlight spring making it appear that an explosion had occurred. The presence of electrolyte which had leaked from an alkaline battery caused the plastic flashlight barrel to experience stress corrosion. The electrolyte has served to accelerate the stress fracture.

Mixing batteries has been identified as a potential hazard (e.g., a used alkaline and an unused alkaline or an alkaline and a carbon zinc). Batteries of different capacity can drive the lower capacity battery into reverse polarity which causes generation of gas and pressure. When the battery becomes pressurized it may leak both gas and liquid.

To help prevent injury, property damage, and prolong battery life, the following rules should be followed:

1. Batteries of different chemical content must not be mixed (e.g., Ni-Cad, alkaline, carbon zinc, etc.).
2. Batteries of different age or voltage potential must not be mixed (e.g., new battery and used battery, a 1.5-volt battery with a 6-volt battery, etc.).
3. Battery polarity and instrument polarity should always be the same to prevent damage (battery installed backward can cause damage).

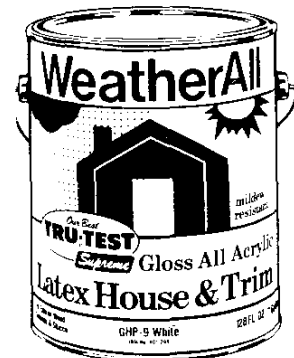
