GREENFORCE

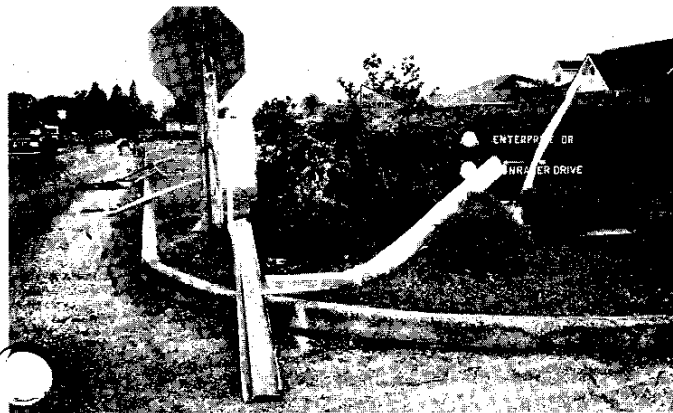

Unable to sleep because of the weather Monday night, I ventured downstairs and stood by the front door watching the rain pelt my front garden. Suddenly the sound of the falling rain changed to a loud rumbling noise, and my heart quickened. I called out to my husband Sid to come downstairs because I suspected a tornado, and then I ran and crouched down in the bathroom. I will never forget the strength-draining fear that gripped me that night or the sense of relief that followed when I knew that the fickle path of the tornado had not included our home. Venturing through the subdivision the next morning was a shocking and humbling experience undefined by words. Why some of us were spared and others not, we do not know, and we can only hope that those lives forever changed by the storm will soon begin again toward a positive future.

Many of you have recently received the annual "beg for donations" letter, and I hope you will find it in your good civic consciences to give what you can to assist the continuation of the GREENFORCE program. As you can see, we have completed two more beds on the boulevard, and the bed at the end of Windward Passage has been replanted. This leaves three more beds to do on the Boulevard and one leading into Moonraker. Future work includes replacing the landscape timbers at the backside of the beds with custom curbs. We made this decision after finding that the timbers constantly shift and are difficult to mow around. We will continue planting with oleander on the boulevard as well as replacing shrubs around pump houses with English hawthorn, which will give seasonal color to the area and will be relatively maintenance free.

The Board is still looking for someone to chair the GREENFORCE committee, and we sincerely hope there is someone out there who is willing to share his or her creative resources through this position. If you are interested, contact Bill Northup or any of the board members.

HOT TIP!!!! The other day while at a hardware store, I found a great garden tool. It looks like half a leaf rake. It is wonderful for raking leaves and debris out of tight places where a normal sized rake won't fit.

EARLY SUMMER REDS

Well, it's time to get into gear, folks, and get all those late spring-time items done around the home. It's also time to take advantage of the beautiful south Louisiana fishing action. Being a snow digger from the North, I can tell you that fishing this time of year is almost like being in heaven. Some basic matching of simple tackle will help you get some fast action and a meal fit for a king. I like to try to use medium size tackle matching my rod to my reel. This seems to make things much easier when casting. It's not necessary to use 40 pound test nor a heavy offshore rod. Try using a 6' 6" rod with medium spinning gear and about 12 pound test. This will give the lure a better simulation and make a good presentation. Also the medium gear will give you a better feel for the bottom along with grassy areas.

Pick up some 1/8 ounce or 1/4 ounce jigheads, plastic cockahoes, or beetles; but the best I've found is 1/2 ounce gold spoons by Johnson, no secret to most fishermen. Now, there are several ways the baits can be used. Most people wanting to catch those big ones should listen well! Next time try popping the bait. When you use the gold spoon work it with short jerks allowing the spoon to fall back into the grass pockets, let it sit for a few seconds then pop the rod tip up fast. This will usually allow the bait to come free of the grass. If it feels like your hook hit a log and then the line suddenly takes off then you probably got "Old Moe," and Baby, hang on! This method catches big reds. Make sure that you have a well adjusted drag and let the fish wear himself down and your chances of landing the fish are much better. I have fished all over the United States and this is exciting fishing! I must warn you that it is not for the weak hearted.

Welcome to the Recipe Box. Whereas I am no food authority, I have been asked to share some recipes here with you. Cooking and recipe collecting are my hobbies. I have about 400 cookbooks and a computer program with approximately 40,000 recipes on it. I belong to Prodigy and am a daily contributor to the Food Bulletin Board. For this month I thought I'd share a variation on the muffuletta which would be a good addition to a picnic meal or for the Fourth of July.

Turkey and Sun-Dried Tomato Muffuletta
Yield: 8 servings

$\frac{1}{3}$ c. sun-dried tomato halves; soak in boiling water for a few minutes to soften
 $\frac{1}{4}$ c. brine-cured ripe olives; pit
 $\frac{1}{4}$ c. olive oil
2 cloves garlic; chop
1 tsp. anchovy paste
2 tb. fresh parsley leaves; chop
 $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. ground black pepper
1 lb. loaf of round white bread
 $\frac{3}{4}$ lb. sliced roast turkey breast
 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. wedge Brie cheese; slice thin
3 medium tomatoes; slice
6 large lettuce leaves

DRESSING: Several hours or a day before serving, prepare dressing. In processor process dried tomatoes, olives, olive oil, garlic, anchovy paste, parsley, and pepper until pureed. Refrigerate until ready to use.

SANDWICH: Cut bread horizontally in half. Pull out some of the soft bread from the center of each half, leaving about $\frac{1}{2}$ " thick. Spread cut sides of both halves generously with some of the dressing. Arrange turkey on bottom half and brush with a little dressing. Cover turkey with layer of cheese and brush with dressing. Arrange tomatoes and lettuce on top of cheese, brush with remaining dressing. Place top half of bread over filling and push down firmly. Wrap loaf with foil. Refrigerate until ready to cut and serve.

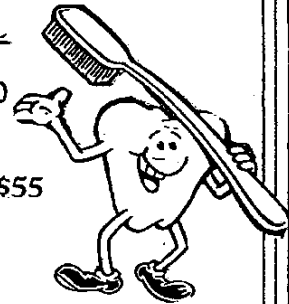

Security Report

May 8 will be hard to forget for most of us. We put on a paid deputy patrol Tuesday night to deter any possibilities of looting.

We regularly have several deputy sheriff paid details in the subdivision, mostly at night when you are peacefully sleeping. This is what allows you to sleep peacefully. They make about three or four complete circuits of the subdivision, occasionally stopping to ticket someone for flagrant violation of the traffic laws.



There have been no speeding violations for less than 39 mph in a 25 mph zone. On one occasion a youngster was apprehended walking down the street looking in cars parked in the driveways. A possible rash of thefts was averted.

The few occurrences of criminal activities have mostly occurred when the guards were not on duty. At the current level of participation we can only afford to have the guards about half the hours needed to have full coverage. Therefore, we have the guards during the hours of darkness when they do the most good. When we achieve a participation of 750 to 800 families, we can get full coverage at the gates. So far this year we have had contributions of about 400 families, down from last year's high of 504. I hope that the second half of the year will bring a turnaround of this decline.

Security P.O. Box Closed

We have closed the Security System P.O. Box to save the unnecessary expense of maintaining a second P.O. Box. If anyone still has a supply of Security System envelopes with P.O. Box 3095 on them, just scratch it out and insert 2746 in its place. This will remain in effect until such time as it is deemed necessary again to have the second P.O. Box. We still have a supply of statements with the old box on it, but we will cross out the old number and fill in 2746 when we mail them.

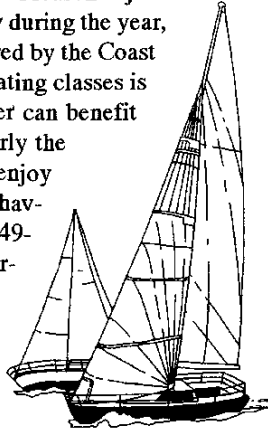

...and left a gaping hole in the roof. Parts of the roof were blown all over the surrounding area.



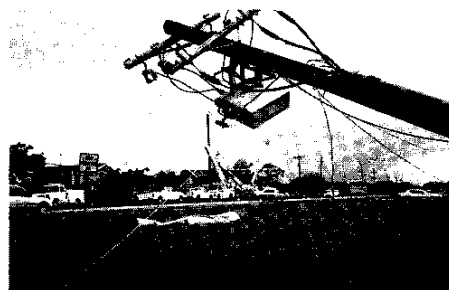
Cars parked in driveways were hit by falling garage doors and flying debris. However, garages weren't that safe either, as 130 Eden Isles Drive shows.

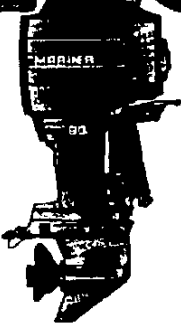

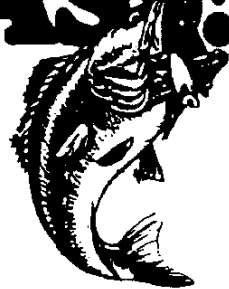

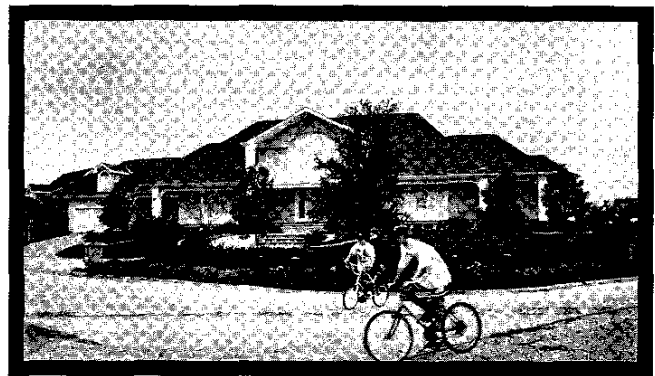
