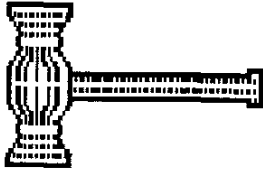

SECURITY UPDATE

For the period of April 1st through July 31st, approximately 45 new families have moved into Eden Isles, which must be some kind of record high for a four month period. Many thanks to those who have joined us in funding the Security Service. We hear repeatedly that the presence of this Service enhances the desirability of living in Eden Isles and contributes to the important decision of making a substantial investment in our community.

The Postal Service informs us that the use of individual account numbers on our invoices is a violation of bulk mailing regulations. The different account numbers result in the bills being "unlike", thus disqualifying them from reduced postage rates. Since these account numbers are not necessary for our bookkeeping purposes, and the reduced postage rate is a significant savings, as of October, all account numbers will be deleted from the invoices.

You may already know that, in response to our request for help from the Sheriff's Department and Parish government to control the dangerous practice of youngsters jumping into the canals from the two bridges on Eden Isles Drive, Police Juror, Milton Gibson introduced an ordinance in June which prohibits this dangerous activity. By adopting it and making "diving" from our bridges an illegal act, the Police Jury provided the Sheriff's Department with some enforcement "teeth". Deputies have responded promptly when called and we have seen a significant decrease in this hazardous pastime. The ban includes fishing from Eden Isles bridges and has now been extended to include all bridges in Police Jury District 13.

I would like to address some comments we have received pertaining to the guards not always being out in front of the guardhouse when on duty. There are

many times when I have observed guards coming in as much as one hour earlier than their shift required. They may use this time to catch up on paperwork or review notices, instructions, new hours posted on their bulletin board; check with co-workers about activity in the subdivision, etc. There are, of course, instances when they are responding to residents' telephone calls or checking in with their supervisors. All in all, they know that it is mandatory for them to be out watching incoming traffic, and I do not believe that there are any serious abuses of this rule.

We have requested the guard service personnel to be especially vigilant where truck traffic is concerned. Due to the increased amount of construction taking place in the subdivision, as well as the fact that the Highway 11 bridge was closed for a two week period, there has been some violations of the "no thru trucks" signs posted on Eden Isles Drive. If the residents would offer the guards a bit more patience, the guards could more effectively perform their jobs and prevent the trucks from entering the subdivision.

We do need and appreciate your feedback and observations, and will always to our best to respond to any complaints.

A special "thank you" to Mary Lou Koch, Irene Ersek and Ina Graff, whose generous help this quarter significantly lightened the arduous task of getting out the invoices. Again, thanks to Mary Lou for her assistance in processing payments, etc. Squeezing all the work in between everyone's vacation trips was not easy, but we did it!

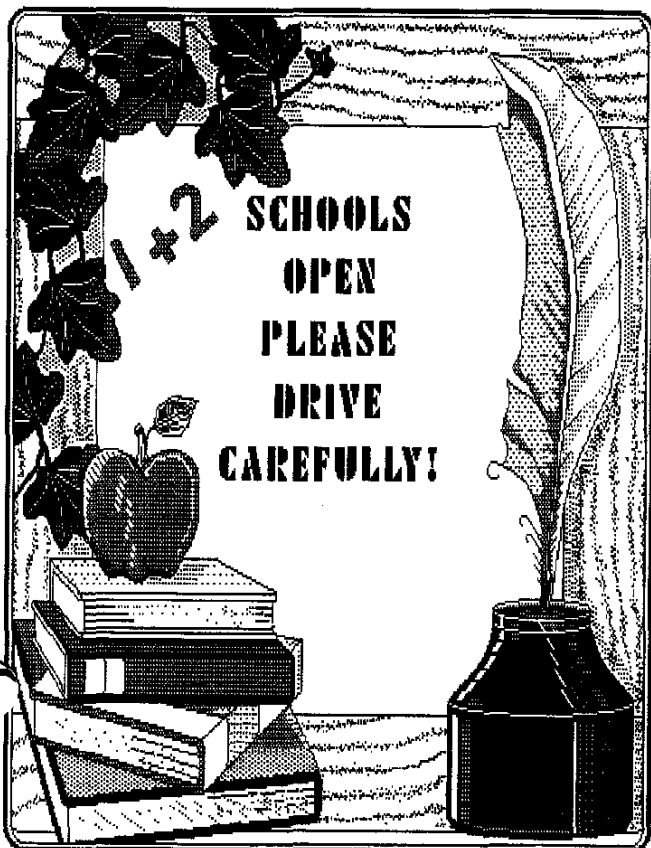

**COAST GUARD
AUXILIARY FLOTILLA**

There is an urgent need for us to establish a Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla here in Eden Isles. Because we are a boating community, and many of us have experienced some kind of trouble while out on a fishing trip or pleasure cruise, we realize and appreciate the value of the assistance provided by the Coast Guard.

Presently, we have only one Coast Guard Auxiliary vessel here in Eden Isles. The Coast Guard would like us to establish a flotilla so that we can better help our own residents, as well as others, when a boating emergency occurs. The prerequisites are as follows:

1. You must own a boat, 16 ft. or longer.
2. You must attend a safe boating class, given by the Coast Guard Auxiliary.
3. You must be at least 21 years of age. There is no sex restrictions or upper age limit.
4. You must attend monthly meetings and take qualification courses to qualify as crew or skipper. The qualification courses are to demonstrate your abilities when participating in an authorized Coast Guard activity. The mission may be search and rescue or patrol missions. Your fuel and oil expenses are reimbursed by the Coast Guard when you are on an authorized mission and your orders are provided to you. When you are on a mission, you will wear the uniform of the Coast Guard Auxiliary and your boat will display the patrol signs and the Coast

Guard mission ensign. Any damages that may occur to your vessel are covered by the Coast Guard while on an official mission.

5. We must have at least 15 members to establish a flotilla.

BITS - N - PIECES

• The Louisiana Public Service Commission granted Lakeside Utilities a \$2.00 increase in the monthly sewage rate charged to Eden Isles customers. The monthly charge will go from \$8.50 to \$10.50 some time in September. This is the second increase in the sewerage rate Lakeside has been granted since 1988. It is also reported that the Utility Company has been sold.

• The Tax Assessor's rolls will be open for public review September 1 through 15. The local governing body (Police Jury) is required to hear and resolve appeals from taxpayers. The St. Tammany Police Jury is expected to hear appeals of assessments from property owners on September 19, 1991 at 4:00 pm.

• Because St. Tammany Parish has not received approval from the federal government for a local redistricting plan, which changed some district boundaries, the election for Police Juror, previously scheduled for October 19, 1991, appears to be postponed.

• Eden Isles residents are in a newly created State Representative district - District 90 (no longer are we part of District 76/Representative Ed Scoggin). We will be electing a person to fill the new seat on October 19, 1991. Get to know the candidates so you can make an informed decision.

• The last day to register to vote in the October 19, 1991 primary election, is September 24, 1991. Absentee voting will take place from October 7 through October 12. You may register and/or complete an absentee ballot at the Registrar of Voters Office, 2124 First Street, Slidell, between 8:30 am and Noon and 1:00 pm to 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday. Proof of residency is required, such as a local driver's license or utility bill. For additional information, phone the Registrar of Voters office at 646-4125.

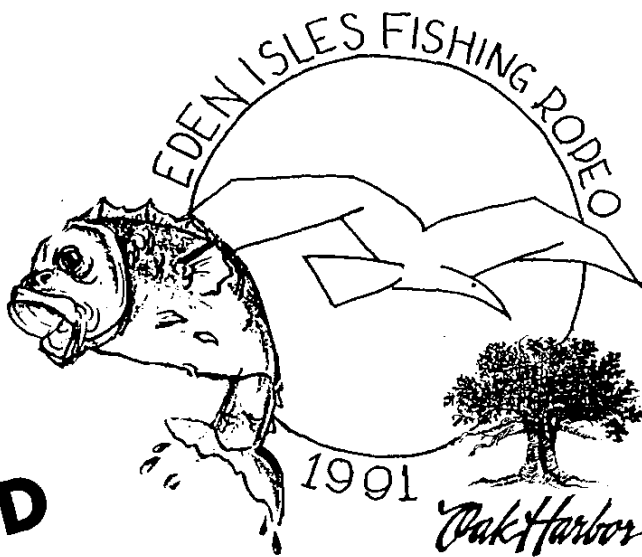

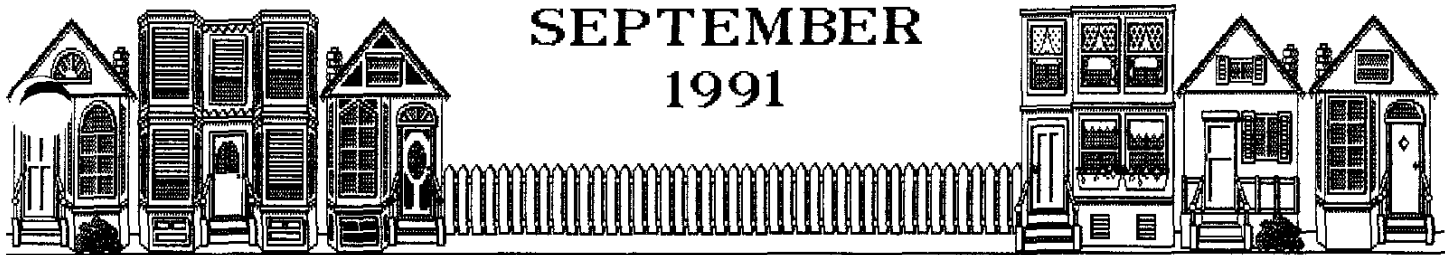

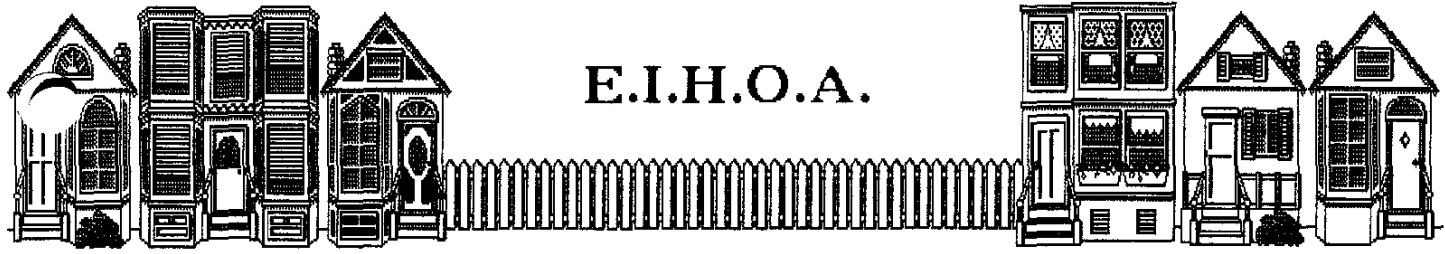
