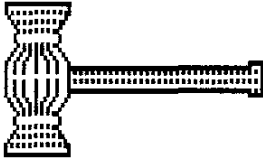

A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

This weekend is our annual **Fishing Rodeo and Poker Run**, details of which are in an attached flyer. Please make an effort to take part in this event. Everyone had a great time last year, and all the proceeds go to a great cause; **Our Subdivision**. Many months ago I was quoted in the Times Picayune as referring to the Landmark houses on Moonraker Drive as "cheap tract houses". This upset many of our new residents on Moonraker, and is still being passed on by word of mouth as a reason for not joining the Homeowners' Association or participating in our activities. I certainly did not intend to offend any new residents, and if I did I must apologize for my offhand remark. The point I was trying to make is that Landmark built 24 houses, 11 on the west and 13 on the east side of Moonraker Drive, with little or no variation in their exterior appearance. you were fortunate enough to buy a new home in Eden Isles for under \$100,000, that's great. It was, and is not my intention to cast aspersions or imply that your homes are inferior in any way.

I hope this explanation will clear up any misunderstandings about my remarks as quoted in that article. For the past two years my primary objective has been to pull the people in this subdivision together into a cohesive unit to promote the greater good of Eden Isles. Without the help of everyone, including our new residents, this objective would be impossible to reach.

Our next Homeowners' Association general meeting will be held on **Tuesday, Sept 29 at 7:30 PM**. In addition to the Nominating Committee's slate, we will take nominations from the floor to fill five vacancies on next year's Board of Directors. If you are interested in serving your community as a Board member, please have a friend put your name into nomination. Elections will be held at the Nov. 24th meeting.

SECURITY REPORT

During last month's hurricane threat to our area, our security guards were on duty and alert, as usual, for any problems. The Sheriff's Department, which normally has personnel divided into 4 shifts (2 off and 2 working) combined shifts so that there were 2 on duty during each 12 hour period, for several days. Supplemental officers from divisions other than Subdivision Patrol, joined with Reserves to augment this around-the-clock patrol of neighborhoods in the Parish. These officers were on alert to help in emergency situations (evacuations, if necessary), and to protect property and maintain order. Our thanks to the Sheriff and the members of his Department for their response to the threat of "Andrew" in our waterfront community.

The Security Committee met on September 14, 1992 to review the year's activities and plan for the last quarter of 1992. A financial statement for the first six months of the year has been prepared and is available to interested security participants; it reflects an increase of approximately \$3,700 spent for more hours of guard service than during the same period last year. The Committee voted unanimously to use off-duty Sheriff's Department deputies again this year for late night patrols between Christmas and New Year's Day. Their presence contributed to a marked decrease in vandalism during the school holidays last year. It is also being recommended that, due to a cost increase, the price of Eden Isles license plates be raised to \$7.00 beginning the first of the year.

We would appreciate it if those residents who will be hosting Halloween Parties will let the guards know "where and when." It will facilitate their handling of traffic and telephone inquiries, as Halloween is one of the busiest nights in the year, especially for "disturbing the peace" complaints.

PLEASE REMEMBER -- this kind

of service is only available because of our guard service. **YOU WILL MISS IT WHEN IT IS GONE.** Our funding always drops in the last quarter of the year, yet this is one of the times when we spend extra money to help keep you and your property safe and secure. We can't do it without everyone caring and sharing in the load. If you aren't helping because you can't afford \$15 a month, send whatever you can. We need your help. We will appreciate your support.

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**TAXPAYER/VOTER
ALERT!**

Saturday, October 3, 1992 is "primary" day for the U.S. Senate and U.S. House of Representatives races, as well as the day that six Constitutional Amendments are to be voted upon. In addition, certain Lighting and Fire District millages that affect Eden Isles residents are up for renewal.

What exactly does a "mill" amount to on your tax bill? Here's how the Assessor's office explains it: One mill is equal to one dollar for every thousand dollars of your assessment, after it is reduced by 10% of its value. Suppose your home has an assessed valuation of \$100,000; your homestead exemption amounts to \$75,000 leaving \$25,000 of value. Reduced by 10%, the assessed value (taxpayer value) is now \$2,500. One mill is equal to one dollar of every thousand dollars of this amount. Thus, if your tax bill was based on a total Parish millage of 166, you would multiply \$2,500 by 166 mills to get your total tax (\$415.00).

Fire District #1, which is the largest in square miles in the State (122) and encompasses about 49% of St. Tammany Parish, presently collects 35 mills annually from every property owner in its district. This tax is the result of 3 separate millages, (2 each for 10 mills and 1 for 15 mills) passed in different years and thus up for voter renewal at 3 different times in the next 10 years. (The later 15 mills, approved in October, 1989, doubled the Fire District's budget and, as a result, 80% of their funds in the 1990 budget went to salary increases; they employ approximately 100 people.)

The present system of asking the taxpayer to renew one millage at a time, as it expires, allows voters the opportunity to monitor and determine, on an ongoing basis, whether the Fire District has used its revenues wisely, has a prudent, detailed plan with which to use any renewal money and, most importantly, whether or not the

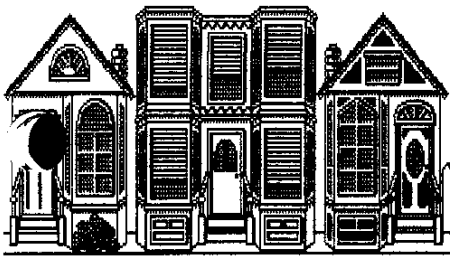
pertinent millage (10 or 15, as the case may be) is still necessary. It makes the Fire District accountable to the taxpayer, even a few years. In this way, should the public favor a reduction in the District's budget, only a portion of the total 35 mills it collects could/would be voted down at any one time.

The Fire District's proposition on the October 3rd ballot is being called an administrative action needed to consolidate the three existing millages so that they run concurrently. If passed, it will take away the taxpayer's option to vote "no" to renewal of 10 or 15 mills (and reduce his tax bill) at various intervals, should the need for this much funding prove excessive. If passed, it would mean that the only option open to taxpayers when renewal of the total 35 mills came up (10 years later), would be to continue to approve or disapprove, the entire 35 mills of funding.

Lighting District #7 was created in August, 1983 when it was carved out of a larger area which encompassed other parts of the Parish. District #7 covers the North Shore Community (Carr Drive, Eden Isles, Oak Harbor, Lakeview Drive), plus a small unincorporated portion of Highway 11/Spartan Drive, and 2 small areas on Highway 433 and Rigolets Avenue.

The funding for District #7 is provided by a 5.29 millage assessed annually on property owners' tax bills. These funds pay the cost of the monthly electric bills to keep the lights burning, as well as for the installation of additional street lights in existing developments. Since the funds and the administration of the District are managed by Parish personnel, the District has no paid employees. Our Police Juror has jurisdiction over the District and appoints a Blue Ribbon Committee of local residents to advise on and assess the needs of the area.




TAXPAYER ALERT! (continued)

The millage of the Lighting District is LESS than that of the Mosquito Abatement District! Using the example given earlier of how the Parish's millage is used to determine your tax, if your assessment was based on a "taxpayer value" of \$2,500, your yearly contribution to the Lighting District would only be \$13.22. Many homeowners pay less than this.

Without this revenue, the lights in the entire area would be turned off by CLECO when the existing funds were exhausted. At that point, private enterprise would be found to take over the billing and collection of fees. In some subdivisions along Military Road, where property owners did not renew millages, this has happened and has resulted in very substantial increases in costs to the residents.



ELECTION DAY 1992

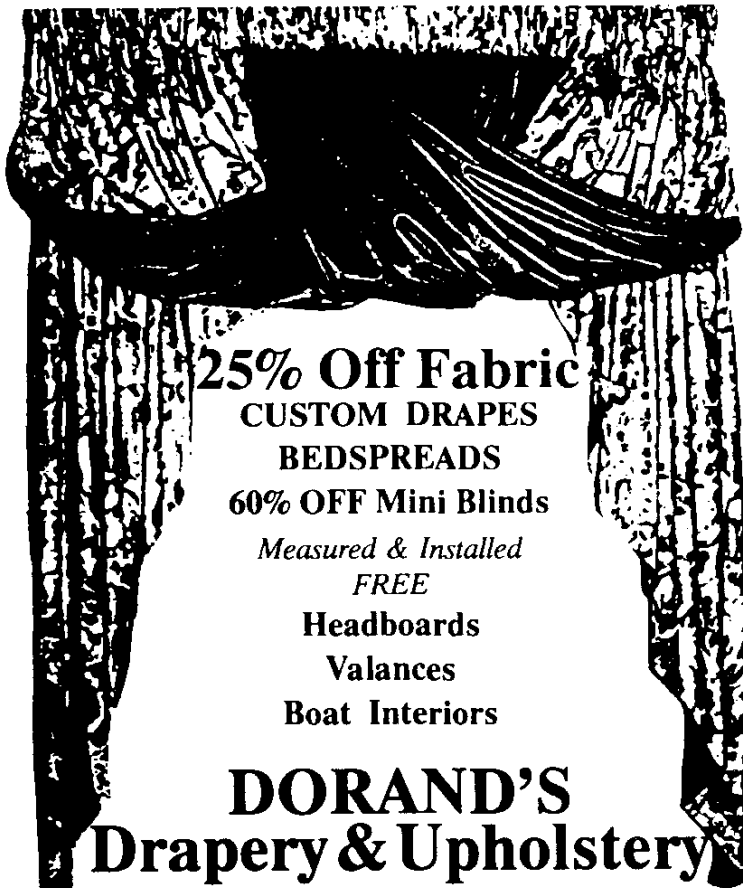
Tuesday, November 3, 1992 is Election Day for the entire Nation. Any Congressional or Judiciary run-offs resulting from the October 3rd primary, will also be on the ballot. Locally, the St. Tammany Parish Police Jury will have on the ballot, a \$5.5 million bond issue for a new criminal justice center, even though they have no specific site or plans for such a center at this time.
