- Harbormaster building is under renovation
- New lease offers some new advantages to tenants:

  - o Tenants can make modifications to their slips, with Orleans Marina approval
  - o Lease continues to allow live-aboards

The marina now has:

- 1500 feet of new decking,
- 50 new cleats
- 9 new dock boxes
- 6 new fire extinguishers—providing 2 per pier
- All lights are up and running and they are in the process of replacing pier lighting
- Security from 7p until 7 a daily

- 1. Accomplishments of OMTA to include:
  - Better working relationship with management and as a result many of the improvements announced by Mr.
    Capo and Mr. Dixon were the direct result of monthly meetings and mutual cooperation.
  - Storm rope
  - Resolved grievances
  - Developed grievance procedure

## 2. Goals of OMTA to include:

- Fundraiser/membership drive
- Free Wi-Fi for OMTA members
- Keep lease payments in line and under control
- Piling stabilization
- Review electrolysis issues

The floor was opened up for discuss. The following were issues that surfaced:

- Magnetic swipe card for oil station and ice machine
- OMTA to develop purchase power—fuel—West Marine etc
- OMTA to build a network of support and to exchange resources
- Use the website for a place to buy & sell (Lee Longstreet said that was currently available)
- Having the Harbormaster office open on Saturdays
- Providing closed circuit video for additional security
